Protect Yourself from the Sun

Skin cancer is the most common form of cancer in the United States.

Over 50,000 people were diagnosed with melanomas of the skin last year.

What about my skin getting just "a little pink"? Unprotected skin can be damaged by the sun's UV rays in as little as 15 minutes. Yet it can take up to 12 hours for skin to show the full effect of sun exposure. So, if your skin looks "a little pink" today, it may be burned tomorrow morning. To prevent further burning, get out of the sun.

What about when it is cloudy? We still need protection. UV rays, not the temperature, do the damage. Clouds do not block UV rays, they filter them—and sometimes only slightly.
