Amberly Foulkrod and Robert Wells to be Soloists for *Requiem*

Soprano Amberly Foulkrod and baritone Robert Wells will be the soloists for *A German Requiem* by Johannes Brahms, Friday, April 10, at noon. This annual observance of Good Friday will be presented in WMSUMC's Sanctuary by the Chancel Choir and Orchestra.



Amberly Foulkrod, soprano, is a native of DuBois, PA. She is a 2006 Magna cum Laude graduate of Ithaca College in Ithaca, NY, where she received a Bachelor of Music in Performance and studied with Deborah Montgomery-Cove. While at Ithaca College, her operatic performances included the roles of Fiordiligi in *Così fan tutte* and Anna Gomez in *The Consul*. Ms. Foulkrod interned in the Housing and Transportation Department for Glimmerglass Opera during their 2004, 2005, and 2006 seasons as well as performed in the chorus of the Glimmerglass productions of *Le Portrait de Manon* and *The Pirates of Penzance*. In the fall of 2006, she performed the role of Cousin in Greensboro Opera's production of *Madama Butterfly*. In the summer of 2007, Ms. Foulkrod attended the American Institute of Musical Studies in Graz, Austria as part of their Opera Studio program. This past year she was a part of the UNCG Tour to Schools, performing the role of Stepmother in *Carmenella*. In April 2008, Ms. Foulkrod performed with Capital Opera in Raleigh, NC, as Fiordiligi in *Così fan tutte*. Ms. Foulkrod is a recent graduate of the University of North Carolina Greensboro where she received a Master of Music in Vocal Performance and studied with Dr. Robert Wells. She is currently teaching private voice and piano lessons and continuing her personal vocal studies with mezzo-soprano Marion Pratkanicki.



Robert Wells is currently Associate Professor of Voice and teaches studio voice and vocal pedagogy. He also serves on the faculty of the Schlern International Music Festival in Voels am Schlern, Italy. He holds the BM in Voice from the State University of New York College at Fredonia, and holds MM and DMA degrees in Voice from the University of Cincinnati College-Conservatory of Music. A frequent recitalist and collaborative artist, Wells has also enjoyed an active performance career in both oratorio and opera in New York State and the Midwest, and his performances have taken him to Great Britain and Europe. He has sung leading roles in *Le Nozze di Figaro*, *Così fan tutte*, and *Albert Herring* and has appeared as baritone soloist in such works as Benjamin Britten's *War Requiem*, Mendelssohn's *Elijah*, and the *St. John Passion* of J. S. Bach. An active choral conductor, Wells served as Director of the Fredonia College Choir and was recognized for his work with numerous professional and community choral organizations in Western New York. Wells formerly served on the faculty at the State University of New York College at Fredonia, where he was Co-Chair of the Voice Faculty and was a sought-after clinician and adjudicator. Dr. Wells is currently the Director of Music Ministry of First Presbyterian Church, in Greensboro.

We welcome both of these fine soloists as they join the Chancel Choir for this meaningful service. The *Requiem*, sung in English, will be conducted by Alice Ann Johnson. Childcare will be provided.

You are happy that you have church at which you get spiritual support and light through the ministries and the other forms of communication, which makes you stronger and more united through the discipleship of our Lord Jesus Christ.

I thank God that I had the privilege to meet some of the members from your church, especially the pastors Dave Melton, and Rob Hutchinson - who showed us God's love in

action towards us. I get updated information about your good intentions and actions by the various forms of ministries pointed to our churches in Pleven, Mizia, and Voyvodovo. Your care for the people in need and active help that you provide through "Mission Together" of churches and people from different countries is powerful tool that impacts the people who are in need, as well as the world that surrounds you. Your ministry in Bulgaria this past year helped the spiritual growth of our partnership. We join, and add our prayers to yours for God's blessing over the nations of the world, and for enhancing the authority to something better.

At the end, I want to thank all members from West Market (some of whom I know from the church directory) for the diligence and the consistency with which they are working for the growth of our Methodist churches in Pleven, Mizia, and Voyvodovo, Bulgaria. A Life Worthy of the Gospel: An Introduction to Christian Ethics

Martin Luther: The Spirit of Christian Life

Luther presents a picture of Christian life grounded in gratitude rather than in obligation, and restores the freedom and spontaneity of Christians' moral existence as "faith made active through love." In other words, we behave as Christians not so that God will love us, but because God loves us. To comprehend this truth is to be set free from the need to justify ourselves. This can be an exceedingly hard lesson to grasp in a world in which we are required constantly to prove our worth and establish our value. How differently would we think and act if we truly looked to God to tell us who we are?

John Wesley: Transforming Grace

John Wesley represents the distinctive contribution of English Protestantism. Unlike some European Protestants, he is as much concerned with "sanctification" (growing in faith and holiness) as he is with "justification" (being put in right relationship with God). In other words, for Wesley it is as important to *live* as a Christian as it is to *become* a Christian. Wesley therefore has a vital appreciation for how the life of faith is nurtured and the progress of holiness fostered. He provides a model for a vital and passionate practice of Christian living, rooted in an active waiting upon God's transforming grace.

“Living On The Edge” at Vacation Bible School!

Even though it is still cold outside, Vacation Bible School here at WMSUMC is closer than you think! This year’s program will revolve about *Camp EDGE (Experience and Discover God Everywhere)*, and includes a powerful curriculum that will bring your children closer to God as they discover that He is with them at all times, in all places, and in all circumstances, ready to help and guide them. Your children will be offered an adrenaline-filled and creative Bible-based program that puts the *extreme* in their faith journey!



As always with VBS, we need the help of so many of you. And you don’t have to be the parent of a VBS child to volunteer your time and materials. *It really is a wonderful time even for those of us more age-challenged children!* VBS is scheduled for the week of **July 20-24**, and we typically need about 75 volunteers for the week. The needs include Rotation Leaders, Preschool Teachers/ Assistants, Recreation Leaders/Assistants, Craft

Assistants, Snacks Leaders/Assistants, and Bible Story Characters. There are a few areas where it is important to have a volunteer who can provide continuity through the entire week, but for most positions we will use whatever time you can give us.

This year we have a specific need for materials. In order to build our Base Camp for Camp EDGE, we need to have 15-20 artificial Christmas trees, preferably of varying sizes. These will be used with care, and we will be happy to pick them up from and return them to your house. We also need stuffed animals that are somewhat realistic, yet not scary. These can include any North American animals such as bears, deer, rabbits, birds, etc. With your help we will be able to build a VBS experience our children will remember all their lives!

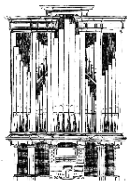
