GENERAL CONFERENCE COMMISSIONING:

Leader: We gather today, united in purpose, to commission those who carry the flame of service and dedication for the postponed 2020 United Methodist General Conference to be held in Charlotte, April 23 – May 3. General Conference is the only body that can set official policy and speak for the denomination. 862 delegates, half clergy and half lay, will come together to consider revisions to church law, as well as adopt resolutions on current moral, social, public policy, and economic issues. The General Conference will also approve plans and budgets for church-wide ministry for the next four years. Delegates will worship, pray, debate, and vote as one body. Volunteers will serve in a variety of ways to welcome bishops, delegates, and guests to Charlotte. Their service will help create the space for holy conferencing.

Delegates and Volunteers: We stand ready, hearts open wide, to serve with courage, love, and pride.

Leader: For this sacred task, we call forth leaders, delegates, chosen and appointed, to represent the diverse voices of our faith, in the spirit of humility and grace.

Leader: May the Spirit of wisdom dwell within you, empowering you to speak truth to power, and to advocate for the marginalized and oppressed, with courage and unwavering resolve.

Delegates: With boldness, we stand for righteousness’s sake; in the face of adversity, we will be attentive to the movement of the Holy Spirit.

Congregation: **May you walk with integrity and wisdom, guided by the light of God's eternal love, as you navigate the complexities of our time, seeking justice, mercy, and reconciliation.**

Delegates: With humility, we embrace this sacred trust.

Leader: For those who will give of their time and talents to offer hospitality to our brothers and sisters from around the world, may your hearts be filled with compassion and your words seasoned with kindness and empathy, as you share unconditional love and respect for all.

Delegates and Volunteers: We covenant to honor the dignity of each soul in our actions and our words as we shine the light of Christ in Charlotte.

Congregation: **As you embark on this sacred journey, know that you are surrounded by our prayers and supported by this community of faith. We are bound together by the love of God.**
